

According to Xinhua News Agency, the Islamic Republic News Agency of Iran reported on June 25 that Iran will hold a state funeral in Tehran on June 28 for senior Iranian military commanders and scientists who lost their lives in the Israeli-Iran conflict. Since the early hours of June 13, Israel has launched large-scale air strikes on several Iranian sites, bombing Iran's nuclear facilities and military targets, killing several senior military commanders and nuclear scientists, including Salami and Iran's chief of the General Staff of the Armed Forces, Bagheri.

U.S. media reported on the 24th, citing Israeli Ambassador to France Zarka, that at least 14 Iranian physicists and nuclear engineers were targeted for assassination in Israel's military strikes against Iran, making it almost impossible for Iran to use the nuclear infrastructure and materials left behind by the Israeli and U.S. military bombings to produce nuclear weapons.

Zarka said the assassins were Iran's top researchers who had almost all the core knowledge, and the disappearance of the entire team of scientists has set back Iran's nuclear program by several years. But the Associated Press, citing some analysts, reported that there were other scientists in Iran who could fill the void, and the assassination could only delay Iran's nuclear program to some extent, but not put an end to it completely.

U.S. special envoy for the Middle East Witkov said in an interview with Fox News Channel on the 24th that the bombs dropped by the United States on Iran have undoubtedly destroyed the related facilities and it is almost impossible for Iran to resume uranium enrichment programs. Witkov said the United States is currently in direct and indirect contact with Iran and is confident of reaching a comprehensive peace agreement with Iran, but the United States will not allow Iran to carry out uranium enrichment activities in the future.

Iran's Atomic Energy Organization head Isami said in a statement broadcast via state television on the 24th that Iran is assessing the losses caused by the military strike, has taken necessary measures, the restart plan has been prepared in advance, and our strategy is right

"Ensure production and services are not disrupted," he said.
